
Dear Ms. MacBride:

I am writing this letter to encourage the Homeland Security Policy Council to support the "Petition for Rulemaking", RM-10108, which is now under review by the FCC.

Our Nation is going through very troublesome times and we must rebuild America's confidence. One very important aspect of Homeland Security is how quickly and effectively Americans are notified when they face immediate danger, such as a biological or chemical attacks from terrorists. DABTCOM Technologies petitioned the Federal Communication Commission (FCC) to consider a new system, known as the DABT System, that we have engineered over the past three years that will greatly enhance both the Nation's Emergency Alert System (EAS) and the National Security Emergency Preparedness Program (NSEPP), including Homeland Security.

The DABT System will directly interface with our national telephone network system, and is capable of alerting millions of people by telephone in as expeditious manor, i.e., delivering alert messages to 40 million telephones within 6 to 14 minutes. Since this would be a national system, all telephone subscribers in the United States would automatically be connected. The subscribers would be alerted by a distinctive ring to stress the importance of the call, and would be informed not only of the nature of the threat, but also what action would be needed.
