On Tuesday, February 19, 2002, Bruce Allan, Mike Riksen and Jay Adrick of Harris Corporation ("Harris"); and Lawrence R. Sidman of Paul, Hastings, Janofsky & Walker LLP, counsel to Harris, met with: Rick Chessen and Keith Larson of the Mass Media Bureau; Bruce Franca and Alan Stillwell of the Office of Engineering and Technology; Michelle Walters of the Common Carrier Bureau; and William Huber of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau to discuss matters in the above-referenced proceeding.
