PETITION FOR RULE MAKING

Columbia Broadcasting Company, Inc. ("Columbia"), licensee of KVMA-FM, Magnolia, Arkansas, by its counsel, hereby requests that the Commission amend the FM Table of Allotments to delete Channel 300C1 at Magnolia, Arkansas and allot Channel 300C2 to Oil City, Louisiana as that community's first local service. If this Petition is granted, Columbia will file an application to modify the license of KVMA to specify operation on Channel 300C2 at Oil City.¹ Magnolia, Arkansas will retain local aural service, and any area losing service from KVMA as a result of these changes will remain well served. Accordingly, the net result of this petition will be a new first local service at Oil City, Louisiana, a preferential arrangement of allotments.

In support hereof, Columbia states as follows:

I. Technical Analysis

1. As demonstrated in the Engineering Statement, Channel 300C2 can be allotted to Oil City, Louisiana at coordinates 32-54-06 North Latitude, 93-44-01 West Longitude consistent with Section 73.207 of the Commission's Rules. See Figure 1. A 70 dBu signal can be provided to Oil City from the proposed reference point. See Figure 2. The relocation of KVMA to Oil City will result in a net gain in population of 198,793 persons able to receive a 60 dBu signal from the station. See Figure 3. The loss area will continue to be well served by more than five aural services. See Figure 4.

II. Change in Community of License

2. In order to grant a change in community of license without opening the license to competing applicants, (i) the proposed use must be mutually exclusive with the existing use; (ii) the proposed allotment plan must represent a preferred arrangement of allotments for the communities involved; and (iii) the original community must not be deprived of local service. *Amendment of the Commission's Rules Regarding Modification of FM and TV Authorizations to Specify a New Community of License*, 4 FCC Rcd 3870 (1989), recon. granted in part, 5 FCC Rcd 7094 (1990) ("*Community of License*"). All three criteria are satisfied in this case. First, the proposed allotment of Channel 300C2 at Oil City is mutually exclusive with the existing allotment of Channel 300C1 at Magnolia. See Figure 1. Second, the relocation results in a preferred arrangement of allotments under the Commission's priorities, since Oil City will receive a first local service (Priority 3) while retaining local service from AM radio station KVMA(AM) (Priority 4). See *Revision of FM Assignment Policies and Procedures*, 90 FCC 2d

88 (1982). Finally, because KVMA(AM) will remain licensed to Magnolia, that community will not be deprived of local service as a result of this petition.

3. Oil City is not located within any Urbanized Area, and the 70 dBu signal will not cover any portion of an Urbanized Area. Therefore, this relocation does not implicate the Commission's policy concerning the potential migration of stations from underserved rural areas to well-served urban areas. *See Elizabeth City, North Carolina and Chesapeake, Virginia*, 9 FCC Rcd 3586 (1994).

4. The Town of Oil City, Louisiana, is a community deserving of a first local service. Oil City is located in Caddo County on eastern shores of Lake Caddo. Oil City is listed in the U.S. Census 2000 with a population of 1,219. The U.S. Post Office associates ZIP Code 71061 with Oil City. The U.S. Postal Service operates the Oil City Main Post Office at 200 Furman Street, Oil City, Louisiana 71061. *See Exhibit A.* Oil City's government functions independently of any other governmental units. It has an elected mayor and five district council members. The mayor and council members each serve four-year terms. The town government has a town clerk, town attorney, police chief, a housing authority and a zoning board. Among the services provided by the town government are local planning and zoning, business permits and licenses, sewer service, and police protection. The Caddo Parish Sheriff's Office has a substation in Oil City. The Oil City Fire District #7-Emergency operates in Oil City offering fire, rescue, EMS and other services to the residents of Oil City. *See Exhibit A.*

5. The Town of Oil City has its own unique identity and history. The area that encompasses present-day Oil City was a rich forest settled by native Caddo Indians. According to local folklore, the 1811 New Madrid earthquake formed the now present Caddo Lake where Oil City is situated. The early settlers were traders, trappers and farmers. The introduction of

railroads in the late nineteenth century brought the advent of industry. With the discovery of oil in the early 1900s in the area, the community was transformed from a bucolic area of hunting, fishing and farming to a boom town, and changed its name from Annanais to Oil City. Reno Hill, a ten-acre red light district, and the rough characters who worked the wells gave Oil City an unsavory reputation. The world's first offshore well was drilled in Caddo Lake in 1911. The Town of Oil City was incorporated in 1945. *See Exhibit A.*

6. Oil City businesses include a wide variety of companies such as Poindexter Auto Sales, South Towne Concrete Products, Inc., Fastmart Grocery Food, Gotto Pizza-Deli, Video Bank, Eve's Garden of Gifts, Inc., Three Sisters Petroleum Oil Company, and W.C. Allen Brothers, Inc. (oil company). A substantial number of businesses identify themselves with the community by using "Oil City" in their names, for example: Oil City Foods (grocery store), Oil City Supply Co., and Oil City Tire. Thackers Airport, a privately owned airport located in Oil City, serves the Oil City area. *See Exhibit A.*

7. The Oil City Public Library is located in Oil City. The library is open three days a week. It has computer and Internet access, meeting rooms, and large collection of volumes. The library has several programs for children that are held during the summer. *See Exhibit A.*

8. The Caddo Parish Public School District provides public education for children in Oil City, through its Oil City Elementary School located in Oil City. Oil City is also home to a number of religious organizations, such as Oil City Church of Christ, Oil City United Methodist Church, United Pentecostal, Ferry Lake Baptist, and First Baptist Church. Among the civic organizations located in Oil City are the Rotary Club of Oil City and Homemakers Club. *See Exhibit A.* Among the events that are held in Oil City are the Annual Chile Supper and Auction, Oil City Gusher Days Festival, Christmas on Caddo Festival and Fireworks, and the "Get


Hooked on Fishing, not on Drugs” Fishing Tournament. Oil City is home to the Caddo-Pine Island and Oil Historical Society Museum and the Ferry Lake No. 1 “First Over Water Oil Well.” See Exhibit A.

III. CONCLUSION

The allotment of Channel 300C2 to Oil City, Louisiana is in the public interest because Oil City will receive its first local service and an additional 198,793 people will be able to receive radio service. Magnolia, Arkansas will retain local service, and the residents of the Magnolia area will continue to enjoy reception of many aural services. The Commission should promptly issue a Notice of Proposed Rule Making as described herein.

Engineering Statement
In Support of a
Petition for Rule Making
KVMA-FM, Oil City, Louisiana

General

We have been retained by Columbia Broadcasting Company, Inc. (herein referred to as “Columbia” as well as “The Petitioner”) to prepare the engineering portion of a petition for rule making. Currently KVMA, channel 300, is a class C1 facility licensed to Magnolia, Arkansas. Columbia wishes to modify §73.202(b) of the Commission’s rules for KVMA. Columbia wishes to delete channel 300C1 at Magnolia and allocate channel 300C2 at Oil City, Louisiana for use by KVMA. The community of Magnolia, Arkansas will continue to be served by KVMA-AM, 630 kHz.

Engineering Exhibits

Exhibit E, Figure 1 is an allocation study demonstrating that the proposed substitution of channel 300C2 at Oil City requires no other spectrum changes. The proposed allocation coordinates of channel 300C2 at Oil City are 27.53 kilometers from the community’s reference coordinates. Exhibit E, Figure 2 is a hypothetical class C2 70 dBu contour map that demonstrates 100% coverage of the proposed community of license, which complies with §73.315(a) of the Commission’s rules. This 70 dBu contour overlaps none of the Shreveport urbanized area.

Exhibit E, Figure 3 shows the population and coverage area gained and lost in the proposed allocation. This exhibit shows that the net area gain of 32 km² and a net population gain of 198,793 persons.

Exhibit E, Figure 4 shows that no point within the proposed loss area will be left underserved.

Conclusion

Columbia's proposed deletion of channel 300C1 at Magnolia, Arkansas and allocation of channel 300C2 at Oil City, Louisiana not only provides Oil City (population 1,219) with its first local service, it also provides service to an increased area and a greatly increased population.





Remaining Services Study**



Oil City, Louisiana

Before the white man came to the area, North Caddo was the rich forest land of the Kadohadacho or Caddo Indians. Folklore tells that in 1811, the great New Madrid Missouri Earthquake formed the now present Caddo Lake.

Earliest settlers were traders, trappers, and farmers. The buffalo moved farther west as civilization penetrated the once wilderness country. In 1903, a "pick and shovel man" camp was built to house crews who built and maintained the railroads.

Steamboats plied the lake and Red River, transporting distinguished passengers, laborers, freight and cotton.



The first oil well in North Louisiana was started in 1904 by the Savage Brothers and Morrival. The pace of life quickened, and by 1910 almost twenty-five thousand people were picking up their mail from the post office.

THE OIL RUSH

The Oil City area went from the peace and serenity of Indian hunting grounds to hysteria due to the "Oil Rush." The city became the first "wildcat town" in the Ark-La-Tex. Reno Hill, a ten acre red light district, as well as the many rough "characters" in the town gave Oil City a "notorious" reputation.




Major oil companies and private individuals quickly leased the oil saturated land, although land had gone from 50 cents to \$500 an acre in one year.

The land was in the hands of a very few. This factor along with the city's bad reputation hindered its growth for a number of years. It became primarily an oil field town with other industry very limited.

In 1910 most of the land around Caddo Lake had been leased, although there was approximately eight thousand acres of the lake bed which had not been purchased. Because of the large amount of production around the lake, most oil men believed that the lake bottom would yield large amounts of oil, but also that it would require a large amount of capital to drill.

The Gulf Refining Company of Louisiana decided to drill in the lake bed. Henry Melat, Gulf Refining Company's drilling superintendent, planned to build permanent drilling platforms every six hundred feet on each ten acre site in the lake bed. In May, 1911, the Ferry No. 1, the world's first offshore well was completed.



OIL CITY TODAY

Today Oil City has been marked as one of Louisiana's historical sites. The Caddo-Pine Island Oil and Historical Society sponsors a museum in the town which houses early oil field equipment, photographs, and other related artifacts.

The Caddo-Pine Island Museum is housed in the city's old railroad depot, donated by Kansas City Southern Railroad. Texaco has donated an oil derrick which now

stands beside the museum, along with other early oilfield equipment.

The museum consists of the old freight room area where the oilfield artifacts are stored. In the Caddo Indian Room Indian relics and arrowheads are displayed. Other miscellaneous artifacts including those from Kansas City Southern Railroad are exhibited throughout the museum.

In addition to three historic boom town buildings and numerous outdoor exhibits on display, a new 12,000 square foot facility will be added to the complex in the near future, insuring the museum's dedication to educate and entertain tourists for many generations.


