Dear Ms. Salas:

Yesterday, Alan Korn of the National Lawyers Guild and I conducted three meetings in the above-captioned docket. We met with Dane Snowden and Margaret Egler of the Consumer Information Bureau; Robert Ratcliffe of the Mass Media Bureau; and Susan Eid of Chairman Powell's office. We asked that the FCC work closely with low power radio applicants to ensure that they have sufficient information to comply with the FCC's rules and to understand the application process. We discussed possible amendments to the FCC's web page, and asked that more FAQs and "plain English" information is supplied to low power radio applicants and licensees. We encouraged the Commission to process LPFM applications with as much speed as possible. We stressed that applicants which rely on volunteers cannot succeed without information on processing that enables them to keep volunteers interested and active.
