On March 1, 2002, James R. Coltharp of Comcast Corporation and I met with Jordan Goldstein, Senior Legal Advisor to Commissioner Copps, and with Susanna Zwerling, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Copps. Our presentation largely addressed matters that have already been covered in Comcast's prior written comments, reply comments, and ex parte reports in this docket. We also contended that the matters at issue in the cable Internet proceeding are capable of resolution now, on the basis of the record in that proceeding, and need not await public comments and a Commission decision regarding the issues associated with high-speed Internet services offered by other entities whose circumstances (e.g., legal obligations and regulatory classification, business practices, technologies, economics, expectation interests, etc.) are decidedly different.
