Gentlemen:

Writing as one of the nation's more than 650,000 licensed radio amateurs, I must complain vehemently about the Land Mobile Service sharing any more of the 440 Mhz band with us or making us secondary users. (RM 9267)

Our becoming secondary users could cause us lots of problems in times of severe weather. As there are no more 2 meter repeater frequencies left in the Tulsa and eastern Oklahoma area, our clubs have been adding 440 Mhz repeaters to help with weather spotting for the National Weather Service.

In Tulsa, we now have the capability to link several repeaters in the 70 Cm Band to cover several thousand square miles, and communicate with spotters in Texas, Arkansas, Missouri, And Kansas, as well as those in Oklahoma. This gives the spotters good coverage, and the ability to protect thousands of lives here in "Tornado Alley".

Sharing more of the 70 Cm band with Land Mobile Services would seriously imperil peoples lives in severe weather situations. I protest any more sharing of the 70 Cm band and ask that the Land Mobile Services request be refused!
