Winter Park Chamber Becomes the First to Endorse Change 4 Kids

In a move to support an increase for public school construction and to endorse the half penny increase in sales tax instituted by the Change 4 Kids campaign, the Winter Park Chamber of Commerce adopted a resolution last week to endorse the campaign. In a meeting attended by area dignitaries, school board officials, chamber officials and guests, J. Blair Culppepper, chairman of the chamber's board of directors, signed the resolution into being, thus making the Winter Park Chamber of Commerce the first chamber in Orange County to adopt the resolution.

Addressing the meeting was Dick Batchelor, local businessman, former legislator, and community advocate, and chairman of the Political Action Committee, Change 4 Kids. Also attending were community activist Howard Roland; Orange County Public Schools Superintendent, Ron Blocker, and Lydia Garner, Clerk of the Circuit & County Courts and the chamber's chair-elect.

Change 4 Kids' job is to work with Orange County Public Schools and its leadership along side with the entire local community to garner support for a half-cent sales tax increase in Orange County.

Batchelor said he got involved with Change 4 Kids because the schools he attended are still standing and badly in need of repair. "The issue is there and just needed someone to step forward," said Batchelor.

According to Batchelor, On

September 10, voters in Orange County will be asked to support a half cent increase in the county sales tax to fund innovation, expansion and new construction of schools for Orange County Public Schools. "The situation is critical," says Batchelor. "Since 1990, 57,800 new students have enrolled in our schools. Orange County is now the 14th largest school district in the nation, and the fourth largest in Florida. Each year 5,000 to 6,000 new students arrive."

He stated that current funding will not meet the need for significant school construction in Orange County. "Our schools, our kids, our communities, will continue to suffer under the weight of inadequate and overcrowded learning environments and its affect upon academic achievement. The longer we let it wait, the harder and more expensive the solution will be to achieve."

In February, Batchelor met with a group of CEOs from the area's leading business organizations to form the independent "Political Action Committee" (PAC) to address the dire need. Their goal is to involve 100 community organizations representing business, non-profits, racial/ethnic groups, parents, teachers and faith-based organizations.

Batchelor has been visiting area chambers of commerce to garner support. "The Winter Park Chamber is leading the way by signing first," said Batchelor. "I expect to see each chamber support the campaign," he added. Several

"This is a truly symbiotic relationship. The Enzian mission, to entertain, inspire, and connect the community through film, meshes perfectly with the vision of the city of Winter Park," said Sig Tiedtke, Enzian president and Florida Film Festival director.

Merchants along Park Avenue have agreed to extend their operating hours on screening days. The rain date for the April 18 screening is Friday, April 19. Rain dates will be determined on a monthly basis.

Enzian Theater is Central Florida's only full-time, nonprofit, cultural arts cinema.

Walt Disney World to feature Chapman's book

Walt Disney World will feature *The Absolutely Essential Guide to Winter Park and its author*, Winter Park resident Robin Chapman at a book signing Saturday, April 20 at the *Epoc Flower and Garden Festival*.

The book signing, which will be included with the regular admission price to Epoc, will take place at the American Adventure pavilion at Epoc from 12 noon to 2 p.m. and from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. The American Adventure pavilion is located across the lagoon from the Epoc entrance, in Epoc's World Showcase.

The Absolutely Essential

Guide to Winter Park is part history, part guide, and partly a beautiful record of the large number of postcards produced during the last century that feature Winter Park, one of the first resort cities in Central Florida.

The postcards are from the collections of two local postcard aficionados: Rick Frazee of Winter Park and Russell Hughes of Orlando. Hughes, 74, has one of the largest collections of postcards in the world.

The book is also a salute to Central Florida, with sections on Central Florida's balmy weather and a look at the local environment, from hurricanes to alligators. Nationally known Rollins College has its own featured chapter.

The book was published Oct. 27, 2001 and is close to selling out its first printing of 5,000 copies. Chapman, a former television journalist, who spent

five years as a creative executive at Walt Disney World, is preparing for a second printing in August.

Chapman's book signing event April 20 at Epoc will provide wide exposure for the book and much wider exposure as well for Winter Park as a cultural tourist destination.

International guests to Walt Disney World traditionally stay in the Orlando area for at least 14 days while domestic visitors stay an average of one week. The Walt Disney World event will mean that the charms of Winter Park will reach an entirely new audience of Walt Disney World guests.

"I couldn't have written this book if I had not been fortunate enough to see the Disney creative process up close," said Chapman. "I hope lots of people from Winter Park and Orlando will come out to Epoc for the book signing event."

The annual Flower and Garden Festival at Epoc attracts tens of thousands of visitors.

Historic Waterhouse Museum Offers Tours

The Maitland Historical Society's renovated 108-year-old Waterhouse residence Museum, located in Lake Lily Park, will be open for tours during the Arts Festival. The experience of Florida 100 years ago awaits you at the historic Waterhouse residence. As you step across the threshold into the foyer, you can almost feel the presence of the Waterhouse family.

When entering the home, one steps back into a simpler time, a period of fashionable gentility, of gracious living, when life

was less complicated. Downstairs the living room gives off a feeling of warmth from the peacock feathers in a living room vase to the lady's and gentleman's chair in the sitting room and the 1872 Singer sewing machine and flax spinning wheel in the window nook.

The Maitland Historical Society invites everyone to visit the historic Waterhouse Residence Museum during the Maitland Rotary Arts Festival.

Volunteers will be available Saturday and Sunday to provide tours of the home, which is fully furnished and ready to receive guests. Admission is free, however, a donation would be appreciated.

The Maitland Historical Society will have their gift shop open again this year.

Also open and ready for visitors is the restored 1884 Waterhouse Carpentry Shop Museum.

Maitland Points of Interest

Visitors to the Maitland Spring Festival this year may not know about the many points of interest in Maitland. They include:

- **Audubon's Center for Birds of Prey** - Each year, Audubon's Center for Birds of Prey in Maitland receives over 600 injured or orphaned raptors (hawks, owls, falcons, kites and eagles). Nearly 85% of all injuries to the birds admitted are related to human interaction, including gunshot wounds, collisions with cars and powerlines, poisonings and loss of habitat. With prompt care, many birds can be returned to the wild. Those who cannot be released are permanently cared for at the Center's aviary. Since 1979, the Center has treated over 8,000 birds of prey and released 3,800 - including over 200 Bald Eagles - back to the wild. 921 S. Lake Sybelia Avenue.

- **Florida Audubon Society the Audubon House** coordinates Florida's environmental education and wildlife protection activities. Founded in Maitland in 1900, the society has become one of the state's foremost wildlife rehabilitation centers, 460 S.R. 436 in Casselberry.

- **Holocaust Memorial Center** - a museum and resource library containing archival materials, the Center welcomes thousands of school children each year intent on understanding the Holocaust. The center sponsors film series, lectures and guided tours of the museum. Hours are 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Mon-Thurs. and 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Friday plus the first and third Sunday of the month, noon to 3 p.m. Call 407-628-0555 for information.

- **Maitland Historical Society and Museums.** The Society operates four museums in Maitland: The Historic Waterhouse Residence and Carpentry Shop Museums, The Maitland Historical Museum and Giftshop and The Telephone Museum. The Society exists to collect, preserve, interpret and exhibit artifacts and records pertaining to the Maitland area.

- **Thurston House Bed and Breakfast** - Nestled in the heart of five acres of beautifully wooded land, overlooking tranquil Lake Eulalia, Thurston House was the winter Florida get-away for wealthy businessman, Cyrus B. Thurston of Minneapolis. Built in 1885, Thurston House has been restored back to its original

splendor. The woodwork of pine and cypress is gleaming-boasting a magnificent built-in server and wainscoting in the dining room, original hardwood floors throughout, six beautiful mantels, and wonderful wood paneling.

- **The Maitland Public Library** located at 501 S. Maitland Avenue was organized in 1896 to serve residents within the city limits of Maitland. The collection contains over 75,000 items, including fiction and non-fiction books, reference materials, audio books and videotapes. Programs for children include Story Hour for Pre-Schoolers on Tuesday at 10:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m., Goodnight Moon Bedtime Stories at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday and a Summer Library Program. The Friends of the Maitland Public Library sponsor a twice-yearly lecture series and hold used book sales in April and October. For more information on library services and programs call 647-7700.

The Maitland Art Center - Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the Maitland Art Center is dedicated to promoting American art and artists - featuring museum exhibitions in its galleries, outstanding instruction by professional artists in its studios, an ongoing series of travel opportunities, and a number of membership and support opportunities - all

in a unique setting. Founded as an art colony in the 1930s by visionary artist André Smith (1880-1969), that tradition continues with resident artists (Artists-in-Action), and a strong curriculum of art instruction in an intimate atmosphere. The Maitland Art Center is located at 221 W. Packwood Avenue.

- **Maitland Area Chamber of Commerce** - The Chamber is a vital part of the community, supporting the activities beneficial to the area and representing our members in city, state and national governmental matters. Fostering growth among the area's already established businesses and lends assistance to new firms or individuals relo-

cating to the area. The Maitland Area Chamber of Commerce, major sponsor of the annual Maitland Spring Art and Fine Crafts Festival, is located at 110 North Majland Avenue.





Selecting a Personal Trainer
