

By the Telecommunications Access Policy Division, Wireline Competition Bureau:

1. Before the Telecommunications Access Policy Division is a Request for Review filed by Contra Costa Electric, Inc. (Contra Costa), a service provider, seeking review of a decision of the Schools and Libraries Division (SLD) of the Universal Service Administrative Company (Administrator).¹ Contra Costa seeks funding for an invoice it submitted to SLD in connection with an internal connections service that it provided under the schools and libraries universal service mechanism.² We have determined, however, that, on April 18, 2002, SLD provided full funding of this invoice. Because SLD has granted the relief that Contra Costa Electric, Inc. is seeking, the Request for Review is dismissed as moot.
