By the Telecommunications Access Policy Division, Wireline Competition Bureau:

1. Before the Telecommunications Access Policy Division is a Request for Review filed by Winnisquam Regional School District (Winnisquam), Northfield, New Hampshire, seeking review of a decision issued by the Schools and Libraries Division (SLD) of the Universal Service Administrative Company (Administrator).¹ Winnisquam seeks review and reversal of SLD's denial of Winnisquam's request to split a funding request between two service providers.² However, since the Request for Review was filed, SLD has granted the relief that Winnisquam is seeking.³ The Request for Review is therefore dismissed as moot.


