On March 29, 2002, Southwestern Bell Telephone Company (SWBT) filed two petitions requesting modification of a local access and transport area (LATA) boundary to provide two-way, flat-rated, non-optional expanded local calling service (ELCS) between the Possum Kingdom exchange and the Graham and Jacksboro exchanges; and the Martin Mill and Tyler exchanges. All the exchanges are located in Texas.
