This letter is to inform you that on June 12, 2002, James B. Ramo, Chief Executive Officer of Movielink, LLC, Peter Sheil, General Counsel of Movielink, and Gary Epstein and myself of Latham & Watkins, counsel to Movielink, met with Peggy Greene, John Beresford, Marybeth Murphy, John Norton, John Wong, Sarah Mahmood and William Cox, all of the Media Bureau; and that on June 13, 2002 the same group met with Bob Pepper, Amy Nathan, and Jonathan of the Office of Plans and Policy, and William Johnson and Rick Chessen of the Media Bureau.

The purpose of each of these meetings was to acquaint the Commission staff with Movielink, a newly-formed joint venture of five major movie studios that will allow consumers to download movies for home viewing over the Internet. Because movie-sized files are very large, the success of Movielink depends on the availability to home consumers of high-speed broadband Internet access. The participants discussed in broad terms the general issues raised by the Notice in this proceeding and the need to foster the development of broadband. The participants asked the Commission to be cognizant of the Movielink model and the potential business and public interest benefits of the Movielink service.
