On 27 June 2002, Tren Griffin, Pierre De Vries, and Marc Berejka of Microsoft, along with undersigned counsel, met with Commissioner Copps and his legal advisor Paul Margie, and with Matt Brill, legal advisor to Commissioner Abernathy. We discussed the future of broadband wireless technology and networking. In the course of those discussions, Microsoft noted that, as suggested by the High Tech Broadband Coalition in its 17 June 2002 filing, the growth of the Internet has been characterized by the ability of consumers to reach an unprecedented array of content, services, and applications through an ever-increasing diversity of consumer-owned devices. Microsoft suggested that the Commission should remain mindful of the importance of assuring that consumers continue to enjoy that ability in the broadband future.
