

Trout Lake, Washington

Trout Lake is a small, peaceful town in Klickitat County with spectacular views and hiking trails that go forever. It is approximately 8 miles from the foot of Mt Adams on Highway 141, and 24 miles from the Columbia River. It is bordered on two sides by National forest, and the rest is State or privately owned.

Trout Lake has it's own post office, country store, beauty salon, full service gas station, and a craft and gift store. We have a women's quilting group, a fantastic book club, and other interesting groups and clubs. The school is modern with an excellent staff and offers education from pre-school to graduation. Even those who are not parents show up for sports events! This warm and friendly town is a perfect place to raise children in a natural, wholesome environment.

Trout Lake also has the largest organic herb farm in the United States, Certified organic by the Washington State Department of Agriculture. Trout Lake Farm grows more than 70 botanicals without the use of synthetic chemical pesticides, fertilizers or herbicides. The farm produces 3 million pounds of herbs each year, including echinacea, chamomile and St. John's Wort. They also have an organic dairy and you can buy their wonderful milk at the local store in town.

Trout Lake and the surrounding area offer endless opportunities for camping, hiking, fishing, mushroom picking, photography, bird watching, white water rafting, boating, kayaking, mountain biking, hunting, rock climbing, skiing, snowmobiling, and horseback riding. This area is building quite a reputation for endurance riding on the endless trails. If you prefer hiking to horseback riding, you can go to Killen Creek Trail, follow it the 3.1 miles to the

Pacific Crest Trail, and hike about a half-mile north to a huge glacial basin and meadow highlighted by a waterfall and super view of Adams Glacier.

We also enjoy some of the most beautiful and rare wild flowers found anywhere, Ice Caves formed ages ago by molten lava, and the Sawtooth huckleberry fields. The White Salmon River is close by and a favorite for kayaking, river rafting, and excellent fishing. Or paddle your canoe and explore Trout Lake Creek, just outside of town. If you like fresh air, clean water and nature, Trout Lake is a slice of Heaven.

The Cascade Mountains form the backbone of Washington, separating the moist and mild coastal side from the drier interior. The range begins in Canada and extends to California. Although less familiar to many people due to its remote location, Mount Adams, at 12,276, is actually higher than the more famous mounts Baker, St Helens, and Hood. It lies about 30 miles east of Mount St Helens and 30 miles north of the Columbia River. The surrounding area forms the Mount Adams Wilderness boasting, 47,270 acres and 64 miles of trail. It starts 9 miles north of Trout Lake on the west slope of Mount Adams in the Gifford Pinchot National Forest.

The Gifford Pinchot National Forest contains 1.37 million acres straddling the crest of the Cascades from the Columbia River north to Mount Rainier National Park. There are more than 30 campgrounds, two major mountains, more than 1,000 miles of trail, about 4,000 miles of roads. There are six wilderness areas in the Gifford Pinchot National Forest: Indian Heaven, Trapper Creek, Mount Adams, Goat Rocks, Tatoosh and Glacier View, plus a small portion of the William O. Douglas Wilderness Area.

If the town of Trout Lake, and the spacious surrounding area, sound like the type of place you would enjoy living, you can buy our piece of paradise. Our Ranch and our llamas are all for sale! 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



5. Go STRAIGHT to get on WA-16 W towards GIG HARBOR / BREMERTON. Drive for 25.3 miles.
6. WA-16 W becomes WA-3 W. Drive for 1.8 miles.
7. Take exit towards WA-304 E / BREMERTON. Drive for 0.4 miles.
8. Go STRAIGHT on NAVY YARD HIGHWAY. Drive for 0.6 miles.
9. NAVY YARD HIGHWAY becomes S CAMBRIAN AVENUE. Drive for 0.3 miles.
10. Turn RIGHT onto FARRAGUT STREET. Drive for 0.1 miles.
11. Turn LEFT onto CALLOW AVENUE S. Drive for 0.4 miles.
12. Turn RIGHT onto BURWELL STREET. Drive for 1.2 miles.
13. Turn LEFT onto WASHINGTON AVENUE. Drive for 0.1 miles.
14. Turn RIGHT onto 4TH STREET. Drive for a short distance.

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
