**FCC Seeks Comment on the National Telecommunications and Information Administration's Report "An Assessment of the Viability of Accommodating Advanced Mobile Wireless (3G) Systems in the 1710-1770 MHz and 2110-2170 MHz Bands."
(ET Docket No. 00-258)**

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) seeks comment on the final report, "*An Assessment of the Viability of Accommodating Advanced Mobile Wireless (3G) Systems in the 1710-1770 MHz and 2110-2170 MHz Bands*" released by the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) on July 23, 2002 ("*NTIA Report*"). This report has also been incorporated into the record of the Commission's *Advanced Wireless Services* proceeding in ET Docket No. 00-258 and is available on NTIA's web site: <http://www.ntia.doc.gov/>.

The *NTIA Report* was prepared by the NTIA, in cooperation with the FCC, Department of Defense (DOD), and other federal agencies, and explores the viability of making all or a portion of the 1710-1770 MHz and 2110-2170 MHz bands available for advanced wireless services. The *NTIA Report* sets forth a plan for the reallocation of 90 MHz for advanced wireless services consisting of 45 megahertz from the 1710-1755 MHz band and 45 megahertz from within the 2110-2170 MHz band.

We hereby solicit comment by **August 8, 2002** on issues addressed in the *NTIA Report*. Comments should be filed in **ET Docket No. 00-258**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) as an electronic file via the Internet at <http://www.fcc.gov/e-file/ecfs.html>. In completing the transmittal screen, commenters should include their full name, Postal Service mailing address, and ET Docket No. 00-258. Parties may also submit an electronic comment by Internet e-mail. To obtain filing instructions for e-mail comments, commenters should send an e-mail to ecfs@fcc.gov, and should include the following words in the body of the message: "get form <your e-mail address>." Filings may also be sent by hand or messenger delivery, by commercial overnight courier, or by first-class or overnight U.S. Postal Service mail (although we continue to experience delays in receiving U.S. Postal Service mail). The filing hours at this location are 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. All hand
