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

## Statement of Herbert Schoenbohm

Herbert Schoenbohm hereby declares under penalty of the laws of perjury that the following is true and correct:

It has now been ten years since I was convicted of using counterfeit access devices (telephone numbers) to make long distance telephone calls. Prior to that time, I had never been convicted of any felony or serious crime of any kind. Subsequent to that time, I have not been convicted of anything, not even a speeding ticket.

Subsequent to my conviction, I have worked hard to rehabilitate myself and to overcome the effects of my conviction. For nearly 8 years, I have held a responsible position with the Virgin Islands government, in charge of expenditures and supervision of large amount of money and property. During that time, nobody has accused me of any dishonesty, connected with my work. Very recently, I became Chairman of the Republican Party in the Virgin Islands.

Amateur radio has played a major role in my life. I was born in 1939, the son of a Lutheran minister. I first obtained a ham license at the age of 14, and, with my father the founder of the Courage Center in Minnesota, participated in a program to assist handicapped persons to become hams. As a licensed amateur radio operator I received many commendations for utilizing amateur radio during emergencies including being named by the VI Governor "Hero of Hurricane Hugo" for keeping vital communications lines open in the aftermath of the most devastating storm ever to hit St. Croix.

At the time of the earlier hearings before the FCC, I was in state of denial, believing that I had been wrongfully convicted of a crime that I did not commit. While I still feel that I was wrongfully convicted, I have come to realize that I was found guilty and that, in the eyes of society, I am a felon. That being so, I have to work especially hard to demonstrate that I am capable of obeying the law and, in particular, the FCC's rules and regulations.

The international radio contest operations, conducted from my home in October 2001 did not violate any rules. Section 97.115(a) of the rules, pertaining to third party traffic, clearly applies only to the delivery of such traffic to people in other countries, something that did not occur. Section 97.115(b) specifically allows a third party to frame traffic under the supervision of a licensed amateur, so long as the third party is not a ham whose license has been revoked. My license was never revoked; it was simply not renewed.





I understand that a hearing regarding your request for an amateur radio license (WT Docket No. 01-352) will soon take place. I have known you since 1966 when you were W0VXO in Minnesota and I consider myself a personal friend of yours. In all those years while I was an engineer on NASA's Apollo Project and the Space Shuttle Program I have never had a reason to question your integrity and I strongly urge that the FCC grant an amateur license to you.

As an amateur radio operator in the past, you have a number of accomplishments that the FCC should be aware of in making their decision:

In 1978 prior to the Jonestown mass suicide, you made the FCC aware of the illegal communications that were taking place on amateur radio frequencies between Peoples' Temple members in Jonestown, Guyana and San Francisco, California.

On numerous occasions you provided emergency radio communications during devastating hurricanes which hit the U.S. Virgin Islands.

The removal of your amateur radio license by the FCC over a year ago (which came about for an FCC violation that had absolutely nothing to do with amateur radio) means that any further such positive contributions you can make to society can no longer take place unless you are granted an amateur radio license.

You are highly respected in amateur radio circles world-wide for your previous accomplishments and you are sorely missed. In previous communications with me, you have expressed remorse for the transgressions you made against the FCC, telling me, "I have learned my lesson."

It would surely be no mistake for the FCC to grant you an amateur radio license.

To whom it may concern:

We have written this letter as a testimony to the good character of Herbert L. Schoenbohm who is known to us personally as a friend and as an amateur radio operator. This letter was not solicited, but is written in the hope that it may help Mr. Schoenbohm regain his amateur radio license.

Mr. Schoenbohm was first known to us in the early 1980's through his operations on the 160 Meter amateur band from St. Croix, US Virgin Islands. His operating habits and skills were an example for others to follow. We missed the opportunity to meet him while we both lived in Ohio. He was in Cleveland, and we were in Columbus.

I conversed with Mr. Schoenbohm more frequently in the late 1980's and early 1990's after he moved back to St. Croix. Admittedly, some of his interpretations were rather strict regarding the activities of the Maritime Mobile Net and the Intercontinental Traffic Net. Mr. Schoenbohm saw these activities as deleterious to the future of amateur radio and was not comfortable to sit back like most other hams and let "business as usual" prevail. In a recent conversation with him, he admits that even though his views were sincere and well-intentioned, he was somewhat Quixotic in his efforts to self-police the frequencies that have been entrusted to us. Mr. Schoenbohm has a strength of his convictions that is not uncommon among people raised in the Midwest. This inability to compromise their core beliefs can be a weakness as well as a strength.

We had the opportunity to meet the Schoenbohm family during a vacation to St. Croix in 1990. He and Monika lived unpretentiously. The ham shack was particularly telling of his regard for the FCC regulations. Living in the 3<sup>rd</sup> world as he does, Mr. Schoenbohm had access to exotic high-powered equipment that most of us only read about. His station was pieced together from the same sort of equipment that would be commonly found in many U.S. stations. This was during the height of the behavior that caused him so many problems later. If there were intentions of breaking the law with regard to illegal equipment, this would have been the time and place to do it with impunity. My point is that he didn't.

I also believe that Mr. Schoenbohm's on-air behavior during the time when his last appeal was pending is very telling of his intentions. Although permitted, he remained away from the contentious frequencies but did participate in several contests on 160 Meters. He could have made a "last hurrah", but that was not his intention. The fighting is over for him. He wants to get his license back.

Mr. Schoenbohm has made many contributions to Amateur Radio over the years. His effort to develop interest in operating on the 160 Meter band is probably the most




I understand you have applied to the FCC for an amateur radio license and would like to vigorously support your effort with this affirmation of your efforts.

Hi Herb,

I've read about your situation and think it's about time that you're given a second chance as it were. I won't delve into past history but what you (allegedly) did isn't in my opinion grounds for you to be banned from Amateur Radio forever. With some exceptions, most people are given at least a second chance for their transgressions.
