
Dear Mr. Schoenbohm:




As a licensed Amateur Radio Operator for 40 years, I am writing to indicate my support for the issuance of an Amateur Radio License to Herb Schoenbohm by the Federal Communications Commission. I first contacted Mr. Schoenbohm by radio as far back as the early 1970's.

I believe that every individual who has violated a local, state or federal law or rule and been convicted or otherwise punished through the judicial system, in whatever format, deserves a chance for rehabilitation. The public interest is best served when every individual can contribute to society what he or she is capable of. I have followed Mr. Schoenbohm's recent activities, and believe him to be fully rehabilitated.

Mr. Schoenbohm was, in my estimation, an Amateur Radio Operator of exceptional technical and operating skill. 
