

**ORDER**

By the Telecommunications Access Policy Division, Wireline Competition Bureau:

1. This Order dismisses the Request for Review filed by International Telcom, Ltd. (International Telcom).<sup>1</sup> International Telcom seeks review of a decision issued by the Universal Service Administrative Company (Administrator) on June 27, 2001.<sup>2</sup> The Commission received International Telcom's Request for Review on November 6, 2001.<sup>3</sup>

2. For requests seeking review of decisions issued before August 13, 2001, under section 54.720(a) of the Commission's rules, an appeal must be filed with the Commission within 30 days of the issuance of the decision the party seeks to have reviewed.<sup>4</sup> Documents are considered to be filed with the Commission only upon receipt.<sup>5</sup> The 30-day deadline contained in section 54.720(a) of the Commission's rules applies to all such requests for review filed by a party



affected by a decision issued by the Administrator.<sup>6</sup> Because the instant Request for Review was not filed within the requisite 30-day period, it will be dismissed without further consideration.

3. ACCORDINGLY, IT IS ORDERED, pursuant to authority delegated under sections 0.91, 0.291, and 54.720(a) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 0.91, 0.291, and 54.720(a), that the Request for Review filed on November 6, 2001, by International Telcom Ltd., IS DISMISSED.
