Dear Ms. Dortch:

On September 19, 2002, Comcast Corporation (“Comcast”) and AT&T Corp. (“AT&T”) filed an Ex Parte Notice responding to certain inquiries by the Mass Media Bureau regarding the interrelationships of the AT&T Comcast Merger Agreement, the TWE Restructuring Agreement, and the AOL Time Warner (“AOLTW”) ISP Agreement. In that letter, the Applicants also responded to Bureau inquiries regarding the nature of the AOLTW ISP Agreement.

As explained in the September 19 letter, the ISP Agreement does not give AOLTW any exclusive rights to provide Internet service over any AT&T Comcast cable system nor does it constrain AT&T Comcast’s ability to negotiate and reach agreements with other ISPs in the future. I hereby certify that these statements are correct to the best of my knowledge and belief.
