Dear Ms. Dortch:

Verizon is filing this Erratum to correct the June and July C2C Performance Reports. There are three categories of revisions as explained following:

First, several UNE Maintenance Aggregate 2-Wire xDSL Line Sharing and Line Splitting metrics no longer have a standard. The affected metrics (MR-2-04-3343, MR-2-04-3345, MR-2-05-3343, and MR-2-05-3345) were incorrectly shown with “Parity with VADI” standards for the June and July 2002 data months. Ad Hoc reports reflecting this change are contained in Attachment 1.

Second, sampling error and z-score data were incorrectly omitted in the June and July CLEC-specific reports for Cox Fibernet and KMC Telecom for the PR-8-01-2200 and PR-8-02-2200 metrics. Ad Hoc reports containing the sampling error and z-scores for these measures for these two CLECs are contained in Attachment 2.

Finally, Verizon is correcting several provisioning Special Services metrics to include activity that was incorrectly omitted due to a mapping error. (One of these measures, PR-6-01-3200, was referenced in the Lacouture/Ruesterholz Declaration and Reply Declaration, pages 47 and 10 respectively). In all cases, the revisions result in improved CLEC aggregate performance. Attachment 3 contains Ad Hoc reports reflecting these changes.

Several of the attachments contain proprietary information and have been redacted. A confidential version is also being filed. Please let me know if you have any questions.
