Attached, and submitted for the record in the above-captioned proceeding, is a press release announcing AT&T's latest third-party ISP agreement, this one with Galaxy Internet Services. This agreement adds to AT&T's prior ISP agreements with Earthlink, Net1Plus, and Internet Central, and Comcast's prior ISP agreement with United Online, as well as AT&T Comcast's ISP agreement with America Online. As previously noted, Comcast has agreed to honor all pre-merger third-party ISP agreements entered into by AT&T, and in connection with the QUIPS Exchange Agreement AT&T Comcast also has a contractual obligation to offer any of its third-party Internet service agreements on non-discriminatory terms with respect to the same cable systems to The Microsoft Network.

Also submitted for the record is a recent Wall Street Journal article that reports on the continuing success of the cable industry in general, and Comcast in particular, in deploying broadband services and obtaining high-speed Internet customers.
