On behalf of Allamakee County Economic Development and citizens of Allamakee County, I would like you to review the enclosed petition and signatures.

Allamakee County is located in the Northeastern corner of Iowa. For many years, the county has had complications with our telephone service in Lansing and Waukon. Allamakee County Economic Development completed a telecommunication assessment in November of 2000. The assessment indicated the county has poor telecommunication services and needs to work together to accomplish the goals.

The major barriers include: Geography, example: the terrain in Northeast Iowa is hilly and does not lend itself well for advanced services such as wireless; Poor and out-of-date infrastructure, example: at times many areas in the Waukon and Lansing area do not have a dial tone which is a major safety issue; The poor infrastructure also stifles business growth, example: businesses want to develop in-home businesses as well as businesses wanting to expand telephone lines and they cannot get the services to their home.

In the Fall of 2001, Allamakee County Economic Development successfully recruited ACE Communications Inc. to come into Waukon as a competitive local exchange. During the process, ACE Communications discovered the ruling Docket No. 96-262 which was passed on June 2001

The economies of scale for a competitive company serving an exchange the size of Waukon (less than 5000 access lines) versus Qwcst, (which serves over 1.1 million access lines in the entire state of Iowa), does not lead to a fair comparison as a basis for access rates.

I am urging you to revisit this ruling. For small communities throughout all of Iowa to survive, we need a strong telecommunication backbone to develop industries, housing and economic development.
