Yesterday, David Dorman, Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer of AT&T, James Cicconi, General Counsel and Executive Vice President of AT&T, Leonard Cali, Vice President – Law & Director Federal Government Affairs, and I met with Chairman Michael Powell, Marsha McBride, the Chairman's Chief-of-Staff, and Christopher Libertelli, Legal Advisor to Chairman Powell, to discuss matters related to the referenced proceedings. During the course of those discussions, Mr. Dorman explained the importance to the consumer and small business markets that the Commission find carriers are impaired without access to all UNEs previously identified without limitations or restrictions.

In addition, Mr. Dorman emphasized the important role that competitive carriers, like AT&T, play in the communications industry. He also emphasized the importance of the Commission preserving competition, in all markets, including the residential broadband marketplace, and that only competition will drive the Bells to invest in their network, not the elimination of competition.

The positions expressed in the meeting for each of these areas were consistent with those contained in the Comments, Reply Comments and ex parte filings previously made in the aforementioned dockets. One electronic copy of this Notice is being submitted for each of the referenced proceedings in accordance with the Commission's rules.
