RE: Multi-Party Petition For Reconsideration Of IBOC Order (Docket 99-325)

Dear FCC Commissioners and Staff,

On October 25, 2002, numerous parties filed a Petition For Reconsideration, in Docket 99-325, to challenge the FCC's Order of October 11, 2002. That Order approved the "interim", essentially unregulated use of In Band On Channel (IBOC) technology for Digital Radio broadcasting.

I filed this Petition as the attorney for these parties. There were 34 parties to the initial filing. Since then, however, 3 parties have asked to be listed as *retroactive signatories* of the multi-party Petition. This has brought the total number of parties to 37.

Today, the total rises to 38. Another party has asked to be listed as a retroactive signatory of the October 25 Petition For Reconsideration:
