Dear Ms. Dortch:

On January 28, 2003, representatives of the Network Affiliated Stations Alliance (“NASA”) met with members of the Commission and their staff regarding the above-captioned proceedings. Specifically, NASA representatives discussed the contents of its January 2, 2003, comments in MB Docket No. 02-277 regarding the 35% national television ownership cap (filed jointly with the National Association of Broadcasters), including the findings of the economic study and survey of affiliates included in that filing. In addition, NASA representatives discussed the positions set forth in its written submissions in the NASA Petition for Inquiry proceeding (DA 01-1264) regarding the appropriateness of a declaratory ruling on provisions of network contracts that are inconsistent with FCC rules and the Communications Act.

The January 28th meetings were with Commissioner Copps and his Legal Advisor Alexis Johns; Commissioner Abernathy and her Legal Advisor Stacy Robinson; Commissioner Martin and his Legal Advisor Catherine Bohigian; and Commissioner Adelstein and his Legal Advisor Sarah Whitesell. The NASA representatives who attended all of these meetings were NASA counsel Jonathan Blake and Jennifer Johnson of Covington & Burling and the following members of the NASA Steering Committee: Alan Frank, Chair of the NASA Steering Committee and President of Post-Newsweek Stations, Inc.; David Barrett, President of Hearst-Argyle Television, Inc. and past Chair of the ABC Affiliates Association; and John Tupper, President of Prime Cities Broadcasting Inc. and Chair of the Fox Affiliates Association. 
