Pursuant to 47 CFR §1.1206, this will disclose that in connection with these permit-but-disclose proceedings, on behalf of the Diversity and Competition Supporters (MMTC et al.) I held a meeting February 28, 2003 at 1:30 PM with Commissioner Copps and his Legal Advisor, Alexis Johns.

At the meeting, I promised copies of our Initial Comments, Supplemental Comments, Reply Comments, and the Statement of National Urban League President Hugh Price, all of which are in the record.

I described how our "Staged Implementation Plan" (described in our Comments and Reply Comments) might operate in practice as a means of ensuring that if deregulation causes harm to competition, diversity, minority ownership or localism, the Commission could apply the brakes until it cures the problem.

I also explained the "equal transactional opportunity" policy described in our Initial Comments.

I drew attention to the Communications Workers of America proposal to replace LMAs with newspaper-type joint operating agreements (JOAs), and noted that we have endorsed this idea.

Finally, I explained our proposal for Diversity Credits as a market mechanism to incentivize diversity. If the plan were designed well, most "command and control" regulation would be unnecessary.
