GLOBAL CROSSING LTD. AND GC ACQUISITION LIMITED FILE May 13, 2003 AMENDMENT TO APPLICATIONS

IB DOCKET NO. 02-286

Petition Date: June 16, 2003

On May 13, 2003, Global Crossing Ltd. (Debtor-in-Possession) ("Global Crossing") and GC Acquisition Limited ("New GX") filed an amendment to their August 22, 2002 applications, reflecting that Hutchison Telecommunications Limited ("Hutchison Telecom") has withdrawn as an investor and that Singapore Technologies Telemedia Pte Ltd ("ST Telemedia") has assumed Hutchison Telecom's rights and obligations in addition to maintaining the rights and obligations originally held by ST Telemedia pursuant to the purchase agreement.¹ By this notice we are providing a comment period on the May 13, 2003 amendment.

We find, upon initial review, that the May 13, 2003 amendment to the applications is acceptable for filing. The Commission reserves the right to return any application if, upon further examination, it is determined to be defective and not in conformance with the Commission's rules or policies.

All filings concerning matters referenced in this Public Notice should refer to **IB Docket No. 02-286** as well as to any specific file numbers of the individual applications or other matters to which the filings pertain.

Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) or by filing paper copies.

¹ The August 22, 2002 applications, as amended by a February 13, 2003 amendment, *see* DA 03-465, released February 20, 2003, and as subsequently amended by the May 13, 2003 amendment, seek Commission consent to transfer control of Global Crossing's FCC-licensed subsidiaries from Global Crossing to New GX, and request a declaratory ruling that the proposed indirect ownership interest in Global Crossing North American Networks, Inc. by ST Telemedia, a Singapore company, is in the public interest under section 310(b)(4) of the Communications Act.

Comments filed through the ECFS can be sent as an electronic file via the Internet to <http://www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs/>. Only one copy of an electronic submission must be filed. In completing the transmittal screen, commenters should include their full name, U.S. Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket or rulemaking number. Parties may also submit an electronic comment by Internet e-mail. To get filing instructions for e-mail comments, commenters should send an e-mail to ecfs@fcc.gov, and should include the following words in the body of the message, "get form." A sample form and directions will be sent in reply. Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and four copies of each filing.

Filings can be sent by hand or messenger delivery, by commercial overnight courier, or by first-class or overnight U.S. Postal Service mail (although we continue to experience delays in receiving U.S. Postal Service mail).
