Global Crossing Petition for Transfer of Licenses to Singtel Telecommunications

Dear FCC:

I want to express my strongest objection to ST Telemedia's petition for the transfer of Global Crossing's license to own and operate a telecom network on the following grounds:

- **Approval of the transfer is a direct threat to the national security of the United States.** STT is wholly owned by a foreign government, is in close alliance with Hutchison Whampoa and will subject this nation to potential cyber attack, espionage, critical vulnerability at times of conflict.
- Hutchison Whampoa has gained control of Asia Global Crossings. Due to the nature of the seamless network design and construction, Hutchison Whampoa, a company deemed too dangerous to permit ownership of the Global Crossing network, **has effective, unlimited access** to the entire 'seamless network' with out any U.S. based and controlled entity that can provide access and control should it become necessary in time of war.
- STT has not demonstrated the necessary "good character" of corporate conduct to be granted a license to operate a public utility. To the contrary, STT has participated in a scheme to defraud investors and bond holders through the collusion with the management of Global Crossing as is evidenced by a confidential agreement signed by the parties **prior to** Global Crossing filing bankruptcy.
- STT has multiple shared investment interests with Gary Winick, founder of Global Crossing suggesting that even after Mr. Winick and his group of founding insiders have extracted over a billion dollars in cash, they have intentionally bankrupted the company, and now they are attempting to maintain ownership through a second fraudulent transfer under protection of the bankruptcy laws.
- There is every reason to believe that transfer of Global Crossing to STT is for additional purpose of defeating a thorough investigation such that certain individuals will evade prosecution.
- Even now there are U.S. owned companies that have publicly stated bids.

Based on these reasons, I humbly pray that you will deny this transfer and thus not only help ensure the security of this nation but also permit the process of justice to proceed.
