Dear Steve,

Our thanks to you and the other representatives from Motorola for your participation in the *ex parte* meeting last Thursday in this proceeding. It was very helpful in furthering our understanding of the interference issues under consideration in this proceeding.

This letter is to confirm the follow-up information that OET requested during the course of the meeting, to help ensure that it is included in your written filing following the meeting. In addition to providing the requested information and any information required under the Commission's *ex parte* rules, you, of course, are free to file any additional information that you wish.

To recap, we requested, and you agreed to provide, a detailed analysis, including assumptions, underlying Motorola's position that its proposal filed in its May 6th *ex parte* letter in this proceeding, when combined with additional best practice measures, should ensure the provision of reliable public safety communications. At a minimum, we intended this request to include the assumptions and analysis underlying Motorola's position that "[a] radio with IM performance of 75 dB and a switchable attenuator that turns on 10 dB of attenuation when the desired signal level is greater than -99 dBm, indicates that potentially interfering CMRS sites within approximately 12 miles will allow the public safety users to achieve the 95% coverage criteria." Motorola *ex parte* presentation of May 6, 2003, at 6.

In order to keep our consideration of the issues in this proceeding moving forward expeditiously, we would ask that you provide this information no later than 10 days after receipt of this letter. Of course, if you have any further questions, please let me know.
