I, David W. Shellman, being first duly sworn, depose and say:

1. That I am employed by the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Schools as an Assistant Superintendent for Technology and have been so employed for the previous four years;
2. That under my supervision and direction, a member of my staff, Mr. Gaff Pearce, prepared and submitted a 470 Form seeking E-rate funding from the Schools and Library Division for a variety of services including, but not limited to, "internal connections", as that term is defined in the federal law and regulations pertaining to E-rate funding;
3. That the 470 Form was posted on the Schools and Library Division website on or about November 15, 2001;
4. Between October, 2001 and January 2002, I spoke to several companies concerning technology needs of the district, a list attached to the affidavit. It is my recollection that in all conversations prior to the November 15 posting, all companies were notified that the 470 would be posted seeking their proposals for many of the items we discussed in our meetings and that the district would be interested in a comprehensive proposal from each company. After the posting of the 470, all companies that inquired were given information necessary to complete a proposal.
5. That during the 28-day period subsequent to the 470 form's posting, I received telephone calls from the several firms expressing an interest in the proposal one of whom was Bell South;
6. That Bell South was primarily interested in selling the Cisco equipment and when it understood the comprehensive nature and breadth of our service needs for internal connections, Bell South decided not to submit a financial proposal;
7. That to the best of my recollection, I responded as fully and completely as I could to their questions but none of them submitted a financial proposal to the district other than IBM;

8. That in response to the firms who called me, I explained to them that we were seeking financial proposals to procure the items listed on the 470 Form, in particular the internal connections listed. As I recall, some of them had specific questions about definition of terms or amount of products and services we desired. I answered all their questions to the best of my ability and all I can say is that none of them other than IBM submitted a financial proposal to the District.
9. That the IBM proposal was fair, reasonable and responsive to our needs;
10. That subsequent to the selection of IBM as the vendor for E-rate funding, the District issued a "Request for Proposal" (RFP) for a firm to serve as a "Strategic Technology Integration Partner (STIP)" to manage the total implementation of the WS/FCS technology plan;
11. That Bell South representatives attended a number of meetings and pre-bid conferences regarding that RFP and after seriously considering that RFP, also decided not to submit a proposal in response to that RFP; and
12. That to the best of my knowledge and belief, WS/FCS complied with the competitive bidding rules of the Commission.


