ORDER

Issued: July 23, 2003 Released: July 25, 2003


At the request of counsel for Business Options, Inc. ("BOI"), a telephone conference was held on July 23, 2003, to discuss procedures on outstanding interrogatories which are objected to by the Enforcement Bureau ("Bureau"). Under the current schedule, BOI has until July 28, 2003, to file a Motion to Compel. See Order FCC 03M-27, released July 18, 2003. It now seems appropriate to permit the parties additional time to negotiate on the information sought by BOI.

Furthermore, from the context of concerns raised by BOI, it seems appropriate to consider possible non-party expert or industry testimony (one witness) to be sponsored by BOI, if requested and deemed appropriate.¹

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that the time for BOI to file a Motion to Compel is extended to **August 7, 2003**, and the time for the Bureau to file any Opposition is set for **August 14, 2003**.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that if BOI intends to seek leave to sponsor expert or industry testimony (one witness), its intention and name(s) and qualifications of possible witness(es) must be filed and served in writing by **August 18, 2003**.²
