This is to advise that on Monday, August 11, 2003 and Wednesday, August 13, 2003, the undersigned, on behalf of Genesis Microchip, Inc., met with Staci Robinson of Commissioner Abernathy's office and Anthony Dale of Commissioner Martin's office, respectively to discuss reply comments filed by Genesis in the above-captioned proceeding.

It was reiterated that, since standards proposed for adoption were not developed by a traditional standards-setting organization with the requirements for disclosure of patents and pending patents the Commission must invoke its patent policy and ensure itself that such disclosure occurs and, moreover, assure that there will be reasonable and nondiscriminatory licensing of patents relative to any standards it adopts. Moreover, it was noted that certain standards, particularly DVI and HDMI standards have never been placed on the record and the public should have an opportunity to read and comment on these standards.
