Yesterday, on October 14, 2003, John Nakahata and Maureen Flood of Harris, Wiltshire and Grannis and I met with the following Federal and State staff for the Joint Board on Universal Service: Vickie Byrd, David Dowds, Greg Fogleman, Paul Garnett, Barbara Meisenheimer, Mary Newmeyer, Joel Shifman, Cara Voth, and Elizabeth Yockus. The substance of our presentation is reflected in the attached document, copies of which were provided for the meeting.

In addition to the attached summary, GCI also emphasized that the goals of basic universal service would be met, and sustainability of the fund would be served, through the implementation of a primary line restriction. To the extent that implementation issues have not been resolved, adoption of the principle now will provide the incentive and opportunity for such issues to be resolved prior to the end of the RTF. GCI also identified a series of unexamined questions regarding ILEC assertions of COLR costs, as set forth in the attached. These questions and their responses demonstrate that ILEC assertions about COLR costs do not provide any justification for the adoption of non-competitively neutral universal service policies, like unequal per-line support.
