
I am writing to nominate a representative to the Universal Service Administrative Company ("USAC") Board of Directors for competitive local exchange carriers, in response to the Wireline Competition Bureau's Public Notice seeking nominations.¹

I would like to nominate Jonathan Askin to the CLEC position on the USAC, formerly held by Dave Conn, of McLeodUSA. Jonathan is General Counsel to the Association for Local Telecommunications Services ("ALTS"), the leading national trade association representing facilities-based competitive local exchange carriers. As the chief legal counsel to ALTS, Mr. Askin focuses on the full range of issues concerning competition in local telecommunications, including universal service issues.

Mr. Askin worked in the FCC's Common Carrier Bureau for two years before joining ALTS. Prior to the FCC, he was a Deputy Public Advocate with the New Jersey Public Advocate and the New Jersey Ratepayer Advocate, where he represented the public on telecommunications and cable television issues. Mr. Askin also practiced law with the New York offices of Davis, Polk and Wardwell, where he worked as a litigator and transactional attorney. Mr. Askin is an honors graduate of both Harvard and Rutgers Law School, and clerked for the late Chief Justice Robert Wilentz of the New Jersey Supreme Court. A copy of his resume is appended below.
