Lilacia Park

Lilacia Park, once home to Colonel William R. Plum's lilac garden, is now a park with "poetic" appeal. The park was bequeathed on the passing of Colonel Plum in 1927. In 1929 the park was landscaped by Jens Jensen of the Chicago Park District. Originally designed as the Plum Memorial Park, the name was changed to Lilacia Park. Since 1929 Lilacia Park has been a source of pleasure for Lombardians and visitors from all over the world.

Alarm Permits[Top](#)

Owners of security alarms, including those in residences, are annually required to purchase an alarm permit for a fee of \$10 for residences and \$25 for businesses. The licensing period for these permits is September 1 to August 31.

To request an application or for questions about whether you are required to obtain a license, please call the Licensing Aide at 620-5905.

Bicycle registrations are now available online. For more information, please refer to the Police Department section of the Village website.

Branch Pickup[Top](#)

A continuing program is the collection of unlimited bundles of brush curbside at residential properties (one to four units); no yard waste sticker is required. The bundles of brush cannot exceed 50 pounds, and must be no more than six feet in length and 18 inches in diameter with no branch exceeding 6 inches in diameter. This program runs from the first full week of April through the second full week of December.

Christmas trees will also be collected curbside at no charge during a two week period in early January.

Building Permits[Top](#)

The Village requires building permits for residential alterations such as decks, swimming pools, additions, fences, garages, electrical and plumbing alterations. Replacement doors and windows do not require permits but must meet certain standards established by the Village. Please contact the Bureau Of Inspectional Services at 620-5750 for more information.

The Village also operates daily commuter parking spaces. These are located along the south side of the tracks between Park and Elizabeth. Fee: \$1.25/day. Temporary daily parking is also available adjacent to the DuPage Theater property on Main Street. Parking permits are available at the Village Hall

Crime Prevention

Top

The Lombard Police Department wants to work in partnership with residents and homeowners as part of our commitment to community oriented policing. The Lombard Police Department advocates that the one of the best ways to protect your home, in your absence, is to enlist the aid of trusted friends, neighbors and / or relatives. We need to work together in crime prevention.

Residents should have a responsible party regularly checking their home while they are away, to help ensure the safety and security of your home and your property. That person should maintain the home in a "lived in" condition, for example, mowing the lawn or shoveling snow, picking up newspapers or other handbills, collecting the mail, opening and closing blinds, and so forth

The Lombard Police Department will respond to your house if the responsible party or neighbor sees something out of the ordinary. In the event that the Lombard Police Department responds to your residence, and we need to get a hold of you or a responsible party, we request that you complete a Emergency Contact Information form, available at the Police Department and also available online [here](#)

Fire Prevention Programs

Top

The Bureau of Public Education is coordinated by a full time Public Education Officer and is composed of two separate, yet related entities. Public Education and Youthful Firesetters Intervention.

The Public Education program is reflective of the cost of fire prevention and safety education programs including the continued use of fire suppression personnel to perform the educational programs. As part of these safety education programs, there is a wide variety of programs that are presented to the over 4,700 children enrolled in the 13 schools and over 1,200 pre-school children enrolled in the area's Pre-schools and Day Care Centers. These programs are widely acclaimed public education programs aimed at disseminating information on various fire hazards and causes.

Garage Sales Permits

Top

The Village does not require a permit for garage sales. Only signs which fit the Village Code are allowed for garage sales. They may not be placed in the Village right-of-way. Please see [Title XV](#), Chapter 153 of the Village code for more information.

Handicapped Vehicle Placards

Top

Temporary Handicapped Vehicle Placards are no longer available at the Front Desk in Village Hall. As of January 1, 2003 you must contact the Secretary of State Office to obtain a parking placard.

No refuse/recycling pick-ups are made on the following holidays:

Pick-ups will be made on the next day. If the holiday falls on a day of the

week prior to your regular collection day, service will be one day later

Parking Restrictions

The Village has parking restrictions during snowfalls. Parking is restricted on streets when snow plowing is necessary.

The Village has parking restrictions on Village streets from 2-5 a.m.. No overnight parking on Village streets is allowed without approval of the Police Department. On-street parking must only be done in the direction of the traffic flow. Parking is also not allowed on the grass or in yards.

Pet Tags

Dogs must be on leashes and cleaned up after. Dog tag applications are available at the Village Hall. An application must be filled out and must include the dog's most current rabies tag number. The annual fee is \$5 and expires the last day of April of each year.

Real Estate Transfers

Planning a move? Along with other utilities, be sure to notify the Village concerning your water/sewer account. Give ample notice for a final reading - a week is preferred. Please provide the new owner's name to be added to the account.

If you are moving, it is important that we have sufficient notice in order to arrange a final reading. It is also important that you give us a forwarding address for your final bill or possible refund due you. For further information, please call 620-5917 or 620-5920.

Refuse/Recycling Service

Lombard and Waste Management offer an attractive wheeled cart as part of the solid waste & recycling collection program. Residents are billed at a monthly rate of \$11.09 for the collection of one 64 gallon cart of refuse per week and unlimited recycling service. Senior Citizens only may request a 32 gallon cart at a monthly rate of \$8.87 by calling Waste Management at 888-656-5350. Proof of age is required.

Large items and additional refuse will be collected provided a refuse sticker is attached. These stickers may be purchased at the Village Hall and at the following locations: Jewel, Cub Foods, Mr. Z's, Schroeders Ace Hardware in the Eastgate shopping center and West Suburban Bank. Refuse should be placed at the curb by 6 a.m. on the day scheduled for your area.

Garbage cans may not be put out on the parkway for refuse pick-up more

than 12 hours before collection and must be removed within 12 hours after pick-up. Garbage must also be placed in covered containers.

The Village imposes a sprinkling ban to conserve water. The sprinkling ban restricts even numbered houses to sprinkle on even numbered days of the month and odd numbered houses to sprinkle on odd numbered days.

Street Light Repairs

Street lights on concrete or metal poles are maintained by a contractor hired by the Village of Lombard. Please call the Public Works Department at 620-5740 to report any outages/mal-functions. Public Works will notify the contractor and the problem will be corrected within 5 working days (weather permitting, parts in stock). If you notice a problem with a street light on a wooden pole, please contact **Commonwealth Edison at 1-800-EDISON-1**. Wooden pole street lights are owned and maintained by Commonwealth Edison.

The Taxi Subsidy Program allows seniors 65 and older and residents with disabilities to purchase \$26 coupon books for \$5 each month. Registration at Village Hall requires a \$4 fee for a photo ID. Applicants should bring their driver's license, state ID card or RTA special user's permit. Coupons are valid for one year from date of issue. Call 620-5700 for more information.

Vehicle Sticker Guidelines

Top

The following guidelines have been set forth for all residents of Lombard in regard to vehicle stickers. Questions regarding vehicle stickers may be directed to the Finance Department.

- Vehicle stickers are valid from May 1 through the following April 30.
- New residents or owners of new vehicles have 45 days after moving in or acquiring a new vehicle to purchase stickers
- New residents with current stickers from their former municipalities are charged 1/3 of the regular fee if the sticker is purchased within 45 days of moving in.
- License plate numbers are required

on all vehicle sticker applications.

- Transfer stickers must be purchased when one vehicle is sold and another substituted for that vehicle. The transfer fee is \$5 (senior citizens \$3)
- Fines for failure to display a vehicle sticker are \$50
- Vehicle stickers are required for all vehicles that are registered to a Lombard address but are housed in a college town

Weather Alert Systems/Sirens

The Village has an outdoor siren warning system that is used to alert the community about possible emergencies or disasters. In the event of a natural disaster, enemy attack or any other vital emergency, the siren will sound. Please turn on your radio to WDCB 90.9 FM for further information. Do not use the telephone.

The siren is activated when severe weather or a storm is detected within five miles of Lombard. Du-Comm, the central dispatch for police and fire in DuPage County, will activate the Village's outdoor warning system.

The warning tone, or "alert tone" is three to five minutes of a steady blast. This means that there is a possible danger, for example, a tornado or severe weather approaching. This should not be confused with the siren heard on the first Tuesday of every month at 10 a.m. This is the time chosen when all warning systems are tested in the state.

Wild Animals

The Police Department does not respond to wild animal calls. If a resident is in need of having an animal trapped, an independent trapper may be contacted. A list of area trappers may be found in the Yellow Pages. Traps are available for a \$5 deposit at the Police Department.

Yard Waste

[Top](#)

Yard waste will be collected once per week from the first full week of April through the second full week of December. Yard waste may be placed in biodegradable yard waste bags or cans, not to exceed 45 gallons.

One \$1.45 yard waste sticker is required on each can or bag with a weight

limit of 50 pounds. Yard waste is collected on the same day as refuse collection. The Village offers a six week Fall leaf collection program. In the Fall residents may dispose of an unlimited number of leaves in brown paper bags at the curbside without yard waste stickers. For specific weeks of the leaf collection, contact Waste Management 888-656-5350.


The TV-6 schedule is developed monthly, depending on the programs that are offered. The current schedule can be found at the Village Hall, as well as on the village web site.

VILLAGE HISTORY

In the mid-1830's, early settlers were attracted to Babcock's Grove, (as Lombard was called at the time) by rich farmland; more settlers came when the railroad route westward from Chicago followed the St. Charles Road Trail



In 1927, Colonel William R. Plum bequeathed his home and adjacent lilac gardens to the town as a park and library site. As a result of Colonel Plum's bequest, the Lombard Park District was established by court order in 1927.

A tour of the historic downtown area, within walking distance of the commuter train depot, highlights the significant heritage earlier residents left to contemporary Lombard: the historic Lilacia Park, Lombard Historical Museum, Helen M. Plum Memorial Library as well as the Maple Street Chapel, a historic landmark in the spired Gothic style built as the original First Church of Lombard in 1870.

Each year during Lilac Time, which occurs during May, Lilacia Park exemplifies the historic beauty of Lombard in bloom. The 8.5 acre park is fragrant with flowering lilac bushes, 75,000 tulips and other spring-flowering plantings. Lilacia Park is the focal point for residents and visitors alike during Lilac Time as well as throughout the changing seasons.



The lilac tradition is never complete until the last unit of the annual favorite "Lilac Parade" has made its way down Main Street. Estimates boast that 55,000+ spectators line the parade route to view and cheer on the various bands, floats and business and civic participants of the ever-growing parade.

During the summer, the traditional "Taste of Lombard" brings thousands out to view, taste and see the sights and sounds the

Lombard Jaycees offer A fourth of July fireworks extravaganza is always a part of the celebration that brings together local vendors, themed entertainment and characters, children's games and other festival activities to round out a larger scale neighborhood event signaturred by the traditional fireworks display

Winter events traditionally include Santa's arrival in downtown Lombard, sponsored by Downtown Lombard United, an association of businesses located in the historic downtown area The Lombard Historical Museum offers a Victorian celebration while other local community groups celebrate the season with musical events and other special activities.



Lombard Park District

For more than 65 years, the Lombard Park District has proudly provided opportunities for people to enjoy life. The Park District has continued to improve and beautify many parks as well as expand recreation programs and special events in order to provide residents with the best parks and recreations programs possible. In 1999, the Lombard Park District was one of only twelve in Illinois to be named an Illinois Distinguished Agency award winner by the Illinois Association of Park Districts and Illinois Park and Recreation Association

The result of a generous donation of land courtesy of Colonel William Plum, the Lombard Park District was established by court order on September 26, 1927. At that time, the Park District was about two miles square and included a population of about 3,500 according to Lillian Budd, author of *Footsteps On The Tall Grass Prairie, a history of Lombard* published in 1977. Much has changed since Colonel Plum made his donation which helped establish Lombard's horticultural and park tradition.




Today the Lombard Park District consists of about 450 acres of land including the popular and scenic Four Seasons. With its

rolling hills and quiet lagoon, Four Seasons is a beautiful park any time of year and is the site of the rustic Log Cabin which was built as part of Lombard's Bicentennial project. The lagoon at Terrace View is perfect for fishing while Lombard Common is a favorite place for sports enthusiasts of all ages to enjoy basketball, soccer, baseball, softball, and tennis. As Lombard's largest park, Madison Meadow provides plenty of open space including playgrounds, walking/jogging tracks and picnic areas.

Of course no description of Lombard Park District would be complete without mentioning the world-renowned 8.5 acre horticultural showcase which is Lilacia Park. A breathtaking floral display, Lilacia Park contains approximately 200 varieties of lilacs and 50 varieties of tulips which bloom every spring. Lilacia Park is the site of many "Lilac Time" activities. A celebration of spring as well as Lombard's horticultural tradition, "Lilac Time" is a village wide tradition that dates back to the late 1920's and attracts visitors from throughout the midwest and beyond.

Still, Lombard Park District is more than beautiful, well-maintained park sites. Its facilities are top-notch and attract thousands of residents and visitors each year. The Moran Water Park, completed in 1990, is one of DuPage County's premier summer attractions. The Moran Water Park includes two 210 ft. water slides, a unique zero depth pool which is perfect for families with small children and a great place for young children to learn to swim, a diving well, lap pool and sand play area, a sand volleyball court, locker rooms and concession area. The water park is also summer events including Terrific Thursdays, Family Splash night and more.
