Dear Mr. Ungar:

This is in response to your letter of January 16, 2001 seeking an interpretation of 47 CFR 15.231. We agree that you may manufacture a wireless security alarm system that requires a "set-up" transmission when the system is first installed. This transmission may be accomplished, without regard to the emissions and periodic limits of 15.231 if it's purely to initiate the system and will only occur once. You must comply with the basic provisions of 47 CFR 15.5 and 15.13, that is not cause harmful interference and use good engineering practice.

I hope this is responsive to your inquiry.
