Dear Ms. Dortch:

On behalf of Custer Telephone Cooperative, Inc. ("Custer"), this will supplement its "Phase II Interim Report and Request for Waiver" ("Interim Report") filed on October 23, 2003. This supplement is filed pursuant to the FCC's direction in its "Tier III" carrier order of October 20, 2003.<sup>1</sup>

Custer reaffirms the information given and waivers requested in its Interim Report. However, Custer is advised that Lemhi County, Idaho, in which it provides wireless service, is now in the process of implementing 911 service for the first time. It expects to be able to process "landline" 911 calls in the third quarter of 2004, with no schedule yet in place for "wireless" enhanced 911 service. As noted in Custer's Interim Report, until such landline service is established, Custer will continue to send 911 calls to US Cellular's switch in Pocatello, Idaho, for forwarding to the local sheriff's office in Custer County. Following the establishment of landline E911 service in Lemhi County, Custer will work with the public safety authority in the county to determine how they wish wireless E911 calls to be routed and processed.



Also, as noted in its Interim Report, Custer plans to begin selling ALI capable CDMA handsets throughout its service area by September 30, 2004 and to follow the rollout schedule described in the Interim Report, so it will be ready whenever Lemhi County has a PSAP which can receive and process wireless E911 calls.
