
Dear Ms. Dortch:

This is to advise you that, on February 4, 2004, Mark Jenn (Manager-CLEC Federal Affairs), TDS Metrocom, LLC, and the undersigned met with Commissioner Martin and Jason Williams (Special Assistant to Commissioner Martin) to discuss issues relating to proposed Commission action on Qwest's Petition for Clarification or Reconsideration of the CLEC Access Charge Order and the US LEC Petition for Declaratory Ruling. The substance of the discussions related to the history of CLEC/CMRS arrangements in the industry and the appropriateness of any action by the Commission other than a reaffirmation that CLECs are entitled to the full benchmark rate, regardless of how they provision their services and what functions they perform.
