Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Tuesday, 3 February 2004, Jeff Campbell of Cisco Systems, Inc. and undersigned counsel met with Jessica Rosenworcel of Commissioner Copps' staff, and separately with Lisa Zaina of Commissioner Adelstein's staff. We discussed the pending Petition for a Declaratory Ruling filed by pulver.com.

During these meetings we expressed the following views on behalf of Cisco Systems:

1. pulver.com's FWD dial-up service is an interstate information service and the Commission should so declare.
2. The Commission should act promptly since FWD presents an easy case of classification under settled law, and the failure to act promptly in such a case creates needless uncertainty and a deterrent to investment affecting unrelated information services.
3. The applicability of CALEA to a variety of IP services is an important issue that should be addressed in an industry-wide proceeding – but this is not a reason to delay decisions on critical VoIP issues whether raised in pending petitions or in proposed rulemaking proceedings.


