By the Chief, Public Safety and Critical Infrastructure Division, Wireless Telecommunications Bureau:

1. On December 11, 2003, the Commission issued a Second Order on Reconsideration in the above-referenced proceeding.¹ In this order, the Commission denied petitions for reconsideration of the *Richardson First Reconsideration Order* in which the Commission had adopted amendments at section 20.18(j) of the Commission's Enhanced 911 (E911) rules that included tolling procedures for wireless carriers to suspend a service deadline.²

2. The adopted date in the Second Order on Reconsideration was inadvertently identified as December 2, 2003. This erratum corrects the adopted date to read December 1, 2003.
