This is to let you know of the tremendous benefit which has resulted from the relationship of our organization with WB33.

The Turning Point (Rape Crisis Center of Collin County) has been in existence for 22 years in the community, and serves more than Collin County and is broader in scope than serving rape survivors. We now serve many individuals from surrounding counties. We serve survivors of any sexual assault, no matter when it occurred, as well as family members or friends who have been impacted by the assault.

During 2003, we serve 858 unduplicated clients, up from 657 in 2002. We had 105 hospital visits, providing support, information, and clothing and toiletries for individuals whose personal property is taken as evidence by law enforcement. We also have an enormous community education program. We provided over 19,092 individuals with safety education in 2003, compared with 18,773 in 2002. The grant through WB33 assisted us with our middle and high school safety education, which has had a tremendous response from the students. They tell us they learn a great deal about staying safe, whether it is avoiding date rape drugs, or sexual harassment, or other situations of risk.

We very much support the continued work of WB33 in providing services to the community, and supporting nonprofit agencies such as our own.

What a sight to see 5,000 people enjoying a free Thanksgiving meal in our gymnasium, KTRE was there. The community saw how their donations to the Red Kettles were used at Christmas as hundreds of families arrived to receive toys and food baskets, KTRE was there.

Because of the generous support of Artie Bedard and her wonderful staff, the task of connecting the donations from the community with the special needs of those whose lives have been turned upside down by crisis has been made much easier for us and for that, we are truly grateful.



There are so many areas where Jerry Hanzsen, and KGAS Radio, have helped our county. The area that has been most important to me as Sheriff of Panola County, is Public Safety. The help that KGAS has given to Law Enforcement and other emergency services make me know just how important and worth while their voice is to our community. The following are some of areas where KGAS has helped:

- Immediate broadcast of city and rural fire departments' response to fires across the county.
- Major accidents that happen and cause roads to be blocked are broadcast to enable listeners to take alternate routes. (Ambulance and Fire Department response is included)
- When Law Enforcement has a manhunt for criminals, KGAS immediately broadcasts the information letting our citizens know description and dangers involved. Also KGAS stays with law enforcement to update movements and information on the manhunt.
- There have been many occasions where law enforcement has had lost children or elderly people. In these instances KGAS has been quick to broadcast location and description of those we are trying to locate. This has resulted in listeners reporting locations of those sought to law enforcement.
- KGAS established a weekly talk show with the Sheriff. This show informs the general public of weekly activities by law enforcement. It also provides a forum to let citizens know of con artists who are operating in our area. It provides a forum to give safety tips to our citizens on dangers such as fire, holiday travel, and gives information on how and why our children are injured or killed. Addresses issues such as DWI, operation of off road vehicles, and safety in water sports.
- For fifteen years we have operated an Angel Tree to help needy children in our community. KGAS Radio has always helped with this program in getting the word out to citizens for support. This has enable the Sheriff's Office to provide gifts to hundreds of needy children each year.


I am aware of other community support given by Jerry Hanzsen and KGAS Radio to our

KPLE-LP TV has received 45 letters from CEO's of non-profit organizations within its' viewing area in the last week stating their appreciation for the contributions the Station has made to their organizations through Public Service Announcements, talk shows and financial donations. KPLE-TV produces a weekly news program covering local events, a 30 minute talk show, a "Gospel Saturday Night" program for local and regional musical talent, and a weekly one hour live Bible teaching program (For Such a Time as This) hosted by four women, each over 75 years of age.

This Station also is and has been a major supporter giving free air time in such projects as:

- ..National Day of Prayer, donating one minute of prayer time to over 40 ministers of different denominations and cultures, and aired during the weeks prior to NDP. Recently, the Station hosted an in-studio Thanksgiving kickoff NDP luncheon for 98 area pastors and 22 spouses.**


