

Las Vegas, NM Petition for rule making

I was looking at my proposal for Cimarron, NM 296C1 (received and inspected at the FCC mail room on November 13, 2002) proposal on the FCC's web site. I noticed a mutually exclusive petition for a replacement proposal for Las Vegas, New Mexico of 296A (received and inspected at the FCC mail room on January 16, 2003). I find 102.48 km separation between our proposals. I find a file number listed of RM-BG-39 for their proposal. I had to do a search for filed comments to find their petition.

The petition from KFUN/KLVK Inc., is to reallocate FM Channel 264C3 from Las Vegas, New Mexico to Pecos, New Mexico, and to substitute FM Channel 296A for FM Channel 264C3 at Las Vegas. At the present time, Las Vegas is the city of license for two AM stations, five commercial FM allotments, one non-commercial FM station, and applications for construction permits for two non-commercial FM stations .

My request for Cimarron, New Mexico 296C1 was to upgrade my proposal of 236C2. My proposal would provide the first audio service to the community of Cimarron, New Mexico. A

Cimarron, NM 236C2 had little opportunity to upgrade. A Cimarron, NM 296 allotment has the potential to upgrade to Class C. For the Cimarron, New Mexico 236 to be a Class C1 allotment, the transmitter site would need to be south and east of Springer, NM. In my engineering search, I found no other possible Class C1 FM allotment for the community of Cimarron, New Mexico. I found my new proposal because the Pueblo, Colorado 296C2 allotment was reallocated to 295C2.

My petition for Cimarron, New Mexico 296C1 was received at the FCC two months before the petition for Las Vegas, New Mexico 296A was received. I request that KFUN/KLVK Inc. initiate another engineering search, to find another proposed replacement allotment, if they want to replace the Las Vegas 264C3 allotment.

To the best of my knowledge, the information contained in this document is correct. If approved, I will submit an application for construction permit for the Cimarron allotment.
