Pursuant to Section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules, Verizon Wireless, by its attorney, hereby notifies the Commission that on April 22, 2004, the following individuals met with John A. Rogovin, General Counsel, Linda I. Kinney, Deputy General Counsel, and Austin C. Schlick, Deputy General Counsel, to discuss the above-captioned proceeding: Steven E. Zipperstein, Vice President - Legal and External Affairs and General Counsel, Verizon Wireless; John T. Scott, III, Vice President, Deputy General Counsel, Regulatory Law, Verizon Wireless; R. Michael Senkowski, Wiley Rein and Fielding; and the undersigned.

We emphasized Verizon Wireless's well-documented views on the legal risks associated with Commission adoption of the Consensus Plan, particularly in a manner that involves a private sale of spectrum to Nextel. We also discussed 1) Nextel's original submission in the docket, which proposed the use of the 2.1 GHz band (rather than 1.9 GHz) as "replacement" spectrum; 2) market-by-market rebanding and licensing of any "replacement" spectrum; and 3) Verizon Wireless's view that the Commission should announce its intent to auction the 1.9 MHz band.
