Comment On Petitions For Reconsideration**

The Home Recording Rights Coalition does not oppose the result sought by the National Cable & Telecommunications Association (NCTA) and the Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA) in their Petitions For Reconsideration dated February 26 and 27, 2004. HRRC believes that the rationale for the result sought is appropriately stated by the NCTA petition. HRRC, however, objects to the additional purported rationales as gratuitously stated by the MPAA, pertaining to downresolution. HRRC affirms its position with respect to downresolution, and other potential impositions on consumers, as stated in its filings in this proceeding, and urges the FCC to act only in accordance with the rationale stated by the NCTA, which is sufficient for the disposition of these petitions.
