Dear Ms. Dortch:

On May 4, 2004, Scott Shefferman of MCI and Ruth Milkman of Lawler, Metzger & Milkman, counsel to MCI, met separately with Paul Margie, Sam Feder and Sheryl Wilkerson to discuss the above-referenced proceeding. In these meetings, MCI urged the Commission to reaffirm the findings of the March 10, 2003 International Bureau Order in the above-captioned docket, consistent with MCI's previous written submissions in this proceeding. MCI explained that its operations with most Philippines carriers are back to normal pursuant to terms and conditions that are acceptable to both MCI and carriers in the Philippines and beneficial to U.S. consumers. In addition, MCI stated that it supports removal of the three rate and volume conditions and the filing requirement of the International Settlements Policy on the U.S.-Philippines route, either as part of Commission order disposing of the Applications for Review of the 2003 International Bureau Order, or as part of a separate proceeding.

Pursuant to the Commission's rules, this letter is being provided to you for inclusion in the public record of the above-referenced proceeding.
