**Comments In Regards To Updating Definitions**

Under Subpart A General Provisions, §97.3 (a) (27) defines International Morse Code as that given in *International Telegraph and Telephone Consultative Committee (CCITT) Recommendation F.1* (1984), Division B. 1. Morse code.<sup>1</sup> That Recommendation was superseded by the ***ITU-T Recommendation F.1*** as of 9 March 1998 according to document listings currently at the International Telecommunications Union.<sup>2</sup> I respectfully suggest to the Commission that, as a matter of keeping the Amateur Radio regulations current, that *CCITT* be changed to ***ITU-T*** as appropriate.
