### CTIA Compromise Plan

<b>What does Public Safety get?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• \$700 million (maximum)</li><li>• Nextel controls selection of Fund Administrator</li><li>• Public Safety is only paid/reimbursed for “direct, reasonable” expenses</li><li>• 2.5 MHz of additional 800 MHz spectrum and 800 MHz rebanding</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• \$3.0 billion (minimum) for incumbent relocation</li><li>• Independent Trustee controls Public Safety fund</li><li>• Independent Trustee decides when Nextel pays and when disbursements are made to Public Safety</li><li>• 2.5 MHz of additional 800 MHz spectrum and 800 MHz rebanding</li></ul>
<b>What does the U.S. Treasury get?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Nothing</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• \$5 billion or more from auction of 1.9 GHz (spectrum appraised at \$5.3 billion)</li></ul>
<b>What does Nextel get?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 10 MHz of spectrum in 1.9 GHz band <b>before</b> it fixes public safety interference</li><li>• 16 MHz of contiguous 800 MHz spectrum</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 10 MHz of spectrum in 2.1 GHz band <b>after</b> it fixes public safety interference</li><li>• 16 MHz of contiguous 800 MHz spectrum</li></ul>
