Hearing Aid Compatibility Report

Cal-One Cellular, LP (“Cal-One”), by its attorneys, pursuant to the Federal Communications Commission’s (“Commission” or “FCC”) *Order* in WT Docket No. 01-309,^{1/} and the subsequent *Public Notice* in the same proceeding,^{2/} hereby files its First Report detailing its efforts towards compliance with the FCC’s hearing aid compatibility requirements. Cal-One is including in its First Report all information of which it has knowledge, but does not address those reporting requirements in the *Order* that can be adequately answered only by the individual handset manufacturers.

I. Carrier Background

Cal-One is a small carrier that provides analog and digital Commercial Mobile Radio Service using CDMA technology in California RSA 1 – Del Norte, under FCC call sign KNKN233.

II. Handsets Currently Offered for Sale

Cal-One currently offers for sale handsets manufactured by Motorola, Nokia, LG and Kyocera. The specific handset models are the Motorola V60i, V60s, 120E,T720 and 7868; Nokia 252, 3585I and 3586I; Kyocera KE414,KE434C, 424, 1135, 2325 and 3245; and the LG VX10, VX3100A and VX4400.

Based on conversations with the manufacturer of each handset that Cal-One currently offers for sale, none of the phones Cal-One has been able to obtain from its third party vendor

meet the Commission's hearing aid compatibility requirements at this time. However, Cal-One does offer hands-free neck loop accessories to allow for conversation by users with telecoil-compatible hearing aids.

III. Hearing Aid Compatible Handset Labeling/Insert Requirement

None of the handsets that Cal-One has available for sale to its subscribers have a label attached on the handset's packaging indicating the U-rating of the wireless telephone. None of the handset packaging contains inserts describing the U-rating system.

IV. Outreach Efforts

Cal-One intends to educate its subscribers, and any potential subscribers, on the functionality of any of the hearing aid compatible handsets it is able to obtain.
