Dear Ms. Dortch:

Yesterday, Martha Fancy and I, both of AT&T, met with Narda Jones and Mark Nadel of the Telecommunications Access Policy Division of the Wireline Competition Bureau. The purpose of this meeting was to discuss AT&T's petition seeking clarification that AT&T's online E-rate reimbursement process allows applicants to pay the non-discounted price for service and complies with the Commission's *Second Report and Order*, released April 30, 2003, in this proceeding. AT&T reiterated that it supports the spirit of the Commission's directive, which is to ensure that applicants are not faced with a cash flow burden when required to pay their bill and wait for reimbursement, and believes that its online reimbursement process complies with the Commission's requirement that customers have the option of paying the non-discounted portion of the cost of services, with the service provider seeking reimbursement for the discount.
