Dear Ms. Dortch:

Pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Commission's Rules, this is to advise you that on Wednesday, June 23, 2004, Curtis S. Shaw, Executive Vice President and General Counsel of Charter Communications; Paul Glist and Chris Savage of Cole, Raywid & Braverman; and Al Mottur of Brownstein Hyatt Farber, met with Jonathan Cody and Christopher Libertelli of Chairman Powell's Office. We discussed the positions of Charter and the NCTA (with which Charter concurs) filed in the ongoing rulemaking proceeding regarding IP-enabled communications. We discussed Charter's willingness to assume certain key responsibilities as a VoIP provider, such as the availability of 911 service and meeting CALEA requirements, as well as the need for access to certain key regulatory rights, such as the right to peer-to-peer interconnection with local carriers, and the right to telephone numbers. We also emphasized the importance of having a unified national regulatory framework for VoIP services that entails only light regulation.
