Pursuant to the Commission's rules, this letter is being submitted electronically to confirm several meetings in the above-referenced docket.

In two separate meetings on July 19, 2004, Arthur W. Conway, Noreen Kaminski, and Craig Lawson of DialAmerica Marketing, Inc. ("DialAmerica"); Wendy J. Hamilton and Karen M. Sprattler of Mothers Against Drunk Driving ("MADD"); and Ian D. Volner and Ronald M. Jacobs of Venable LLP met with Commissioner Jonathan Adelstein and his legal advisor Scott Bergmann, and then met with Commissioner Kevin J. Martin and his legal advisor Daniel Gonzalez.
